# HULL TO HORNSEA RAIL TRAIL



**Distance** 13 miles

**Time** 1.20 hours one way  
(cycle)

4.5 hours (walking)

**Level** moderate

This wonderful route takes you from the bustling city of Kingston upon Hull, across the beautiful flat agricultural landscapes of the Holderness plain to the small seaside resort of Hornsea.

This route forms part of the Trans Pennine Trail and can be either cycled or walked. The route was created by the walking and cycling charity Sustrans ([Sustrans.org.uk](http://Sustrans.org.uk)) with the help of local authorities. It's a flat route, mainly on asphalt tracks, most of which are traffic-free and there are TPT/National Route 65 signposts all along the route.

### To follow the Hull to Hornsea route:

Exit Hull Paragon station's main entrance, cross Ferensway at the

lights, and bear right then left onto Paragon Street. Turn first right into South St. then left onto Carr Lane. Follow TPT / National Route signs (and the cycle lanes) all the way to where the traffic-free section starts off Damson Lane.

You are soon walking or cycling through the lovely countryside of the Holderness Plain with open views of woodlands, fields, and eventually the sea!


Stay on the trail all the way to Hornsea, taking care when crossing minor roads, and giving way to walkers and horse-riders. Take a break on the way at pubs in the pretty villages of New Ellerby and Great Hatfield.

The route takes you right through to the seafront and beach in Hornsea with its panoramic coastal views. Enjoy seaside attractions, cafes, pubs, fish and chip shops and play areas for children. Back towards the freshwater mere (Yorkshire's largest lake!) is a small award-winning museum of local life.

If you want to take a shorter ride to Burton Constable Hall, go through the parking area at New Ellerby and past The Railway Inn. Keep straight ahead out of the village and turn left as the road bears right into Old Ellerby. Follow the quiet lane round to a T-junction, turn right and right again into the Hall's parkland. Entry into the Stables Tearoom is free.

For those walking there are buses from Hornsea New Road back to Hull Interchange, every hour.
