MALTON TO PICKERING BIKE RIDE



Distance 12 miles


Time 2 hours

This new 12 mile cycling route connects the historic market towns of Malton - Yorkshire's Food Capital, and Pickering - home to the world-famous North Yorkshire Moors Railway. The route will take cyclists through beautiful villages, alongside lush farmland and key attractions including Beck Isle Museum, Eden Camp, Flamingo Land, Malton Museum, North Yorkshire Moors Railway and Pickering Castle. The paths on the cycle route mainly follow existing country roads and bridleways.

North Yorkshire's new 12 mile Market Town Route connects the historic market towns of Malton - Yorkshire's Food Capital, and Pickering - home to the world famous North Yorkshire Moors Railway.

Weaving gently through a 'secret' river valley, surrounded by lush farmland and sleepy villages, along country lanes and resurfaced bridleways with barely a hill in the way, it's much more than an idyllic rural ride.

This is a lovely ride to connect the two Market Towns and to access the North York Moors National Park from the train connection at Malton. For centuries, Malton and Pickering have been the heart and soul of Ryedale, and that's just as true today. You couldn't choose two nicer places to visit.

Only a few miles away from each other, they're vibrant, pleasure-seeking 'country centres' of award winning shops, galleries, antiques, attractions and eateries, unique in the UK.

There are key attractions along the way too, including Beck Isle Museum, Eden Camp, Flamingo Land, Malton Museum, North Yorkshire Moors Railway and Pickering Castle.

They're also the perfect place to stay, surrounded by some of Britain's most beautiful countryside, with luxury accommodation and cycling from the doorstep.

The route is signposted along the way and most of the route is on flat quiet country lanes.
